DIY Lavender Soap from Cathy Kennedy



Supplies needed:

Silicone Bee Mold
Goat's Milk Soap
Lavender Essential Oil
Lavender Flowers
Plastic container
Cheap whisk (or another cheap utensil)

Note: The Goat's Milk Soap I purchased from Amazon came in two individually wrapped blocks. For this recipe I only used one of the blocks.

Melt Goat's Milk Soap in increments of 30-40 seconds. Stir in-between each zap time until soap is a liquid. It'll appear milky. My instructions were to work fast because the soap supposedly sets up fast. I didn't notice any problem but worked quickly. I added approximately 24 drops of lavender oil. First whiff is a bit strong but don't worry about it. I added approximate a quarter cup of lavender flowers (it looks like seeds to me) as well. You can skip this ingredient if you don't want to added expense. Next, I poured the mixture into one of the silicone bee molds. I left it along to dry for 24 hours before removing from molds. The soap released easy-peasy and the final product looks beautiful.
